Drama Teacher

Job Description



For this specific position, the ideal candidate will:

- Have a passion for drama and working with children
- Have experience as a drama instructor in an educational setting (desirable)
- Be highly organised and have the ability to work collaboratively
- Be keen to contribute to the life the school and community, through service and discipleship
- Have completed a university degree (required)

All staff at St. Timothy's are expected to:

- Exemplify and articulate a vibrant relationship with Christ and be active in a local church, with a substantial record of service and leadership in the body of Christ
- Be in agreement with the Basis and Philosophy of St. Timothy's Classical Academy (as found on website, www.st-timothys.ca) and be interested in working in an interdenominational Christian setting
- Work collaboratively with the Director, fellow teachers, and parents in building up the school
- Maintain high standards of personal conduct in all aspects of their lives
- Teach from a Christian worldview perspective, and where required/needed/possible point differences with current and/or different worldviews present in the works studied. Emphasise that which is True, Noble, Good and Beautiful. Where it is deemed right, make connections with the Bible, e.g. forms of literature, Bible inspired Art, etc.
- Encourage students to pursue wisdom and virtue as the ends to their education

Specific to the Drama Teacher Position:

- Term 1: Teacher Grades 5-6 students foundational drama techniques and orientate them in the "grammar of drama".
- Term 2: Teach the Grades 7-8 classes as scheduled by the Director with view to performances at the Artfest.
- Work with other teachers in preparing students for the Artfest (and other) performances.

- Ensure that school policies related to teachers and students are implemented in the classroom and school (e.g. safety, discipline, dress)
- Report directly to the Director
- Work with the Director and other staff to decide upon material for performances and curriculum in keeping with the classical Christian model.
- Administer day-to-day activities and coordinate schedules with the Director.
- Understand your role as teacher and, given the unusual circumstances of a small school, be able to request additional help as required either from the Director for organisational issues or for volunteer assistance.
- Communication with parents:
 - present formal report card comments and grades as agreed with the Director

All applicants must have filed a police check and be cleared in order to be considered for employment.
